Hi over the past 3 months massive changes have been taking place within CRI Rebound the main one being the closing of the Base in Pontefract and our workers moving into new Hubs throughout the Wakefield district alongside TYS and YDSS in an attempt to offer a better holistic service to our Young People. Although we can see how much better it is to work alongside fellow agencies and how much more we can achieve through multi agency work we have noticed a massive decrease in referrals to CRI Rebound from NEET organisations even though these young people appear to be the most vulnerable, to substance misuse. ### Advice surgeries - now in Wakefield!

From West Yorkshire Community Accountancy Service (WYCAS)

We are always seeking to improve awareness of and access to our services. We are now expanding our regular advice surgeries to include the Wakefield area. The advice surgery gives you the chance to chat through your accounting needs and queries or simply drop off/collect your books and records.

In the Wakefield district we will be alternating on the second Tuesday of each month between Wakefield (at VAWD – Upper York Street) and Castleford (at AgeUK – Bank Street). The first surgery will be at VAWD on 12th February from 10am-12pm.

## Reports

### The State of Child Neglect in the UK

Action for Children has published this report, *The State of Child Neglect in the UK*. It surveyed 6000 people including the general public, a range of professionals and 27 local authorities. Action for Children recommends:

- The Government must honour its commitment to increase early intervention services with clear statutory duties for early help included in the new Working Together statutory guidance.
- The Government must revise the inspection framework so that no local authority can receive an excellent inspection rating unless it demonstrates sufficient and effective early help services.
- The Government must commission Ofsted to conduct a thematic review on child neglect focused on early intervention.
- The Government must urgently implement the integrated child health and welfare check recommended in the Tickell Review and ensure that it is appropriate, accessible and easy to use.
- The Government must introduce a web-portal for the public to seek help for children they are worried about. It should include a facility to report concerns about a child directly to the relevant council area via a postcode function.

## Funding

### Foyle Foundation

The Small Grants Scheme is designed to support smaller charities in the UK, especially those working at grass roots and local community level, in any field, across a wide range of activities. Applications are welcomed from charities that have an annual turnover of less than £100,000 per annum. Larger or national charities will normally not be considered under this scheme. Nor will the Scheme generally support charities that are able consistently to generate operational surpluses or which have been able to build up unrestricted reserves to a level equivalent to three months turnover. We plan to make one year grants of between £1,000 and £10,000 to charities which can demonstrate that such a grant will make a significant difference to their work. If you cannot demonstrate this, your application will be declined. Please note that demonstrating ongoing sustainability is also important, particularly if you have recently lost local authority or other regular funding. No multi-year funding awards will be made. ### Percy Bilton Charity

The Percy Bilton Charity is a grant-making trust and company limited by guarantee founded in 1962.

Grants include organisations assisting disadvantaged youth and people with disabilities. Social workers may apply on the behalf of individuals who have a disability or mental health problem for grants to purchase basic furniture, equipment and clothing. Organisation that may apply should be a registered charity in the U.K. whose primary objectives are to assist groups including:

Disadvantaged/underprivileged young people (persons under 25)

People with disabilities (physical or learning disabilities or mental health problems)

They have 2 programmes for organisations:

Large grants – one off payments for capital expenditure of approximately £2,000 and over; i.e. furniture and equipment; building/refurbishment projects. (Please note that they do not fund running costs.)

Small grants - Donations of up to £500 towards furnishings and equipment for small projects. This programme is more suitable for smaller organisations. The amount offered will usually depend on the number of applications received in relation to the funds available for distribution. You may therefore not receive the full amount requested.

### Henry Smith's Charity - Outings for young people

Applications can be made for grants towards holidays or outings within the UK for children aged 13 and under who are from areas of high deprivation\*, are experiencing disadvantage, or who have a disability. Their funding is for holidays or outings that provide children with an experience they would not otherwise have the opportunity to access. Trips can be to countryside or city locations, but must be outside the children's immediate locality. They are

able to fund day-trips as well as longer residential trips, but are less likely to fund trips to high cost attractions (e.g theme parks). Grants of between £500 and £2,500 can be considered. However, they are only able to fund a maximum of two-thirds of the total cost of a trip as we expect some of the funding to be raised elsewhere. Please be aware that, if they make a grant to your organisation, they may not be able to award you the full amount you ask for. Visit the website for full details:

### **Tesco Charity Trust Community Awards**

The Tesco Charity Trust Community Awards Scheme provides one-off donations of between £500 and £4,000 to registered charities and not for profit organisations who are working on local projects that support children and their education and welfare, elderly people and adults and children with disabilities. There are four rounds of funding each year. Applications should be made via our online application form. The People's Postcode Trust small grants programme funds projects of up to six months in length, ranging from £500 up to £10,000. They fund different parts of the country in their four funding rounds each year. The small grants programme exists to try to make the world a better place through short-term, project specific funding of up to six months in length, ranging from £500 up to £10,000.

### **Open letter to Education Secretary**

Twenty-six youth organisations - including NCVYS, the National Youth Agency (NYA) and the YMCA - have signed a joint open letter to the Education Secretary on the Government's approach to youth services. The letter calls for urgent clarification of the Education Secretary's comments to the Education Select Committee that youth services were not a priority for central government and should be the responsibility of local government instead. The signatories also argue that the move to hand responsibility for youth services to local government would contradict last year's Positive for Youth statement.

## Bits and Bobs

### Young people call on Gove to invest in youth services

Young people representing youth projects across the UK have written to Education Secretary Michael Gove calling for greater investment in youth services. [The letter](#), from 15 youth organisations representing more than eight million young people, follows comments made by Gove last month, in which he suggested that youth policy is not a central [government priority](#). A survey supporting the letter, carried out by the organisations, revealed that 92 per cent of young people feel ministers do too little to show they care about young people, while 95 per cent said youth policy should be a key priority for national government. The letter described Gove's comments as "alarming", adding that the thinking could put the future of young people in the UK "at risk". "We agree that all sections of society need to work together to support young people to achieve, but for this to happen we need the government to recognise the importance of youth services," the letter said. "Removing responsibility from central government would be hugely damaging to both the quality and quantity of youth support on offer." **We have signed it – have you?** Read more at CYP Now:

### Young people to probe Gove's dismissal of youth policy

Education Secretary Michael Gove's assertion that youth policy is not a government priority is to come under the scrutiny of a group of young people, who will take up their grievances with children's minister Edward Timpson. Gove made [the comments](#) last month during an education select committee meeting about ongoing reforms at the Department for Education, stating: "Youth policy is a priority for local government and not central government." The words have prompted more than 100 senior figures in the sector to sign a [joint letter](#) warning that a lack of government interest in youth services risks triggering social unrest. The National Scrutiny Group – which is composed of fifteen 11- to 19-year-olds formed to ensure government policies that affect young people take their views into account – has revealed it will probe Gove's remarks at its next meeting on 25 February. The group will produce a report following the meeting, which children's minister Edward Timpson will attend. Read more and CYPNow:
